We are taking in new members and supporting new groups from the YMCA, Girl Scouts and more.

Exciting new possibilities are taking shape but they are not things I can do by myself or with the help of just a few. These new things will require all of us...including you.

It isn't that I am weak or that too few of us are committed. What God is calling us to is bigger than we are and that is exactly as God has planned it. There are 2 places in Scripture where God speaks to this design where we need each other: Romans 12:3-8 and 1 Corinthians 12:12-31. Through the Apostle Paul, God describes the Church as a body that needs all its members to function well and be healthy. Just like our physical bodies and in accordance with the analogy God uses in Scripture, when we are lacking the full function of some of our organs, we are not healthy. In order for Sunrise Church to remain healthy and vital, we need all our members to be active. No matter how gifted some of us are or how committed others of us are, unless we are all functioning Sunrise Church cannot be healthy. God designed us to need each other...and that's why I need you.

When you joined Sunrise Church you promised to serve God and faithfully participate in the ministries of Sunrise Church with your prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness (see Hymnal page 38). Neither I nor anyone else at Sunrise Church is qualified to define specifically what your faithful participation means. I am asking you to prayerfully consider what your faithful participation means and know that we need you...I need you...and God designed it that way on purpose.

September brings an end to vacation season and the hot weather transitions to cooler weather as hints of fall begin to emerge. Kids go back to school and this is a perfect time to make changes in our lives. What new worship patterns might you adopt? What new study patterns might you adopt? What new steps towards God might you take? Is this a time to sign up for a Bible Study we're offering or Sunday School class? Might this be a season for you to consider leading a group or study? Is God asking you to host a study or group in your home (especially since physical space at Sunrise Church is so limited)? I need you and whatever your faithful response to God through Sunrise Church might be. I'm not ashamed. I'm asking...and telling...I need you because God designed it that way. Will I see you at Church this week or weekend?

Parenting In The Pew

Sunrise UMC is blessed with an abundance of young families - babies, children, youth, and parents committed to raising them in the church. Sunday mornings present an interesting quandary, however: how can we all worship together when my kids have a hard time paying attention, and I'm distracted by their distractedness?!

As children of God, we are all called to come and worship as the body of Christ here on earth. Through our worship, we are reconnected and restored in our relationship with our Creator and Lord. Psalm 46:10 calls us all to "Be still, and know that I am God." We learn to do this when we come together to sing songs, pray for one another, hear the Word of God, and join in fellowship together. Some of us remember clearly being taught how to "go to church"; others may be learning for the first time how to worship together with others.

Our children, however, are ripe and ready to "learn the ropes" of being in the sanctuary and all the different parts of worship in a corporate setting. In "Parenting in the Pew", Robbie Castleman encourages parents of their vital role in this time and place to raise up young disciples.


"Parents teach their children how to make beds, hit baseballs, figure fractions and shop wisely. There are shelves of books, columns of advice and lots of good reasons for developing those skills...[However] very little has been written about training children to worship (22)."

She reminds the reader that "the first seven years of a child's life are 'prime time' for this training" - offering two questions to consider:

- Is he/she learning to behave properly in church God's house?
- Is he/she learning to keep the Lord's Day holy?

She writes: "Parenting in the pew can be a hot battle or a holy triumph of grace...it can contain the most intimate moments of life with God's family together in his presence." Through Children's church this fall, we hope to instruct young children in the basic components of worship and how God calls them to come to Him. Likewise, Sunrise's children's ministry will focus energy and enthusiasm in teaching parents more about 'parenting in the pew'! As we all journey together, let us continue to draw near to the Lord of Life who will lead us all in learning to love Him with our hearts, minds, souls and strength!






Find Help. Discover Hope. Experience Healing: Divorce Care Classes coming this Fall




It's Almost Fair Time!


